BASIC COURSE LIVE SURGERY FAQ



To ensure a seamless live surgery day and minimize the risk of disappointment or challenges in implant placement, kindly read the instructions thoroughly.

Q. How can I forward the scan data?

All participating dentists in the live surgery are required to fill out the 'Live Surgery Case Submission' form.

Uploading scan data and patient details is mandatory. Failure to have this form in our system will result in the course director being unable to access the case.

Q.Is there a due date for case submission?

Yes, the submission deadline is set at least 10 days before schedule surgery date.

Q. Can I send you CD-Scan data?

All DICOM data should be submitted to us exclusively through the 'Live Surgery Case Submission' electric form. Please refrain from sending CDs to our office, as the AU Post service is not available for our building

Q. Does my patient need to take a CT Scan?

Every patient must undergo a CT scan (DICOM), and the case must receive assessment and confirmation from the instructors before proceeding with the surgery. No exceptions will be made.

Q. What if I can't find the patient by the due date?

The extra cost \$1,000 you made will be refunded in full.

Q. Am I allowed to join Live Surgery component only?

No, the live surgery is an additional component of the Basic Implant Surgery course. Participation in the live surgery session is exclusively reserved for participants enrolled in the basic course

Q. Is it possible to bring my own assistant?

Unfortunately, the live surgery clinic is exclusively reserved for registered course participants.

Q. I don't register the live surgery but can I come for observation?

Due to limited space, we are unable to accommodate observers in the clinic. However, you are more than welcome to join us as an assistant doctor. If you are interested in this assisting role, please let us know, and our team will make arrangements for you in the surgery schedule.

Q. Am I allowed to place more than one implant?

No, the cost covers only one implant placement.

Q. What should I bring for the surgery?

Our team will ensure that everything is prepared for the live surgery. You are welcome to bring your loupes if you prefer to wear them.

Q. When is my surgery schedule confirmed?

The surgery schedule will be confirmed five days before the surgery date once the due date has passed. It operates on a first-come, first-served basis.

Q. What are the guidelines for patient selection?

- Good oral health and healthy adult.
- Limited bone resorption: recent extractions will usually need 4 months of healing prior to surgery.
- Mesio-distal width of at least 7mm is preferred.
- Good access and space to restore.
- Typical single tooth sites are the best: lower premolars or lower 1st molar.
- Low aesthetic risk-low smile line
